Message from the 41 International President

On your behalf, I would like to express our sincere thanks to Forest of Dean 41 Club who arranged the AGM & Conference for 41 Club Great Britain & Ireland. In particular I would like to mention Dave Green the Convenor & Dick Stanley the Registration Officer for their excellent organisation & hard work (I think that they actually enjoyed it as have all members of Forest of Dean 41 Cub who were involved).

We said farewell to Past President Dieter Straka (Austria) & welcomed Matti Hinttala (Finland) as Vice-President. Jean-Louis Boileau (France) follows Matti Hinttala as Vice-

President next year & then, I believe, that India will be nominating N S Krishna Kumar ('KK') as India hosts the Presidency in 2012/2013 after France.

We have a new Treasurer in David Illingworth (now of Cyprus), a new Editor in Rajan Mittal (India) & a new webmaster in Gunnar Stumpf (Germany). Our sincere gratitude goes to Renato Bonfini who has been Mr—International Website for more than 10 years; & to Bob Parton who assumed the post of Editor some three years ago when the International Magazine 'Courier' had been absent for a time. Bob Parton created a magazine of which 41 INTERNATIONAL has been justly proud. My thanks go to the 'three musketeers' - Ha De Gesch, Bruce Morgan & Bob Parton - for arranging my coronation at the Thistle Hotel Cheltenham on Saturday 25th April 2009. All those who witnessed the splendid occasion will probably agree with me that the three of them seemed almost natural in their chosen outfits.

I am pleased to say that 41 Club continues to expand. I am aware that new Clubs are being started in Rabat (Morocco), Melita (Malta), Iceland, Sri Lanka, Uganda & Rome. These are the ones which I know about - I am sure that there are others. Randolph Riedlinger (Italy), our International Extension Officer, is keeping an eye on developments.

There are four other matters which I would like to mention in this report. The Young Ambassadors Exchange ('YAP') programme continues to give young people, who are members of a 41 Club family, an insight into the culture & way of living of another country. Germany, Belgium, India & South Africa are particularly active in this programme. The Strategic Working Group was born at the International AGM in Merano under the leadership of Past President Beat Berger to examine & secure the future of 41 INTERNATIONAL. We expect to receive an interim report at the Half-Yearly Meeting in October 2009. France have proposed a new fees & voting structure for the Member Associations of 41 INTERNATIONAL which I have asked David Illingworth & Bob Parton to look at, reporting to the Board in the near future. The Board will then be making its recommendations to the Half-Yearly Meeting. Randolph & I met with Round Table International, Ladies Circle International & Agora Club International at the RTI AGM in Netherlands recently, under the umbrella of a 'four clubs one vision' synopsis created by George Psaras, the RTI President. Tangent, who represent most of the former members of Ladies Circle, were not invited as they were perceived to be 'not international'. Council will have to decide at the Half-Yearly Meeting whether a meeting with the other three international Associations gives added impetus to our international relations.

The 41 Clubs of Germany, New Zealand, Italy, Cyprus, France, Romania, India, South Africa & Belgium together with Round Table International have all warmly welcomed me to their AGMs since I took over as International President. Vice-President Matti, standing in for me, has been welcomed at Denmark, Norway & Austria. Thank you all for your kindness & generous hospitality (Helen also says a big thank you on the occasions when she accompanied me) & I have to say that the friendship, camaraderie, humour & laughter were superb, all for the benefit of 41 Club & 41 INTERNATIONAL. Thank you very much.

We are all gathering together in Sursee, Switzerland for the Half-Yearly Meeting at the end of October & I look forward to seeing many of you again then. Werner Blessing & his team are organising an exciting weekend, which includes the Half-Yearly Meeting of 41 INTERNATIONAL, the Annual General Meeting of Club 41 Suisse and the Charter of Club 41 Lucerne number 112.

Take care, & please continue to appreciate the friendships made in Round Table & 41 Club. May the hinges of friendship never rust.



Tangent India New Horizons

Tangent India, the national body for Tangent Clubs in India, held its 1st Annual General Meeting on 12th September, 2009 at Kolkata. It was a well attended meeting represented by members from 5 out of the 6 clubs which form Tangent India as well as several guests. We were specially honoured by the presence of Helen Bellwood, First Lady of 41 International & Tangent member from UK at this historic meeting. Sameer Nayyar, the only gentleman present, is the Tangent Coordinator for the Assn. of 41 Clubs of India. Jogi Mittal who had held the post of President for 3 years since the formation of Tangent India passed the responsibility on to Rachna Jain the new President from Delhi. Reeti Roy from Kolkata was nominated Vice President. She takes over as President in 2010.

Looking Back

Just over 3 years ago, an enthusiastic bunch of Past Ladies Circlers, Past Tablers' Wives and 41ers wives across the length and breadth of Mumbai took off on a tangent to initiate a movement which has already been highly successful across the UK, Germany and some other parts of Europe. It was the then President of the Assn. of 41 Clubs of India, Sameer Nayyar who acted as the catalyst for the formation & charter of the 1st Indian Tangent Club in Mumbai in May 2006.

With 2 more clubs chartered in Delhi in September the same year, Tangent India was formed & recognized at the 41 Clubs' National AGM at Agra in September 2006 with Jogi Mittal from Mumbai as its 1st President. Despite the initial speed at which Tangent took off, response from across the country was a little tardy. During the last three years, 3 more clubs have been chartered in Hyderabad, Delhi and Kolkata, the last 2 having been chartered as recently as September 2009. We now have 6 clubs representing North, East, West & South India & with further expansion the target is to create a truly pan-Indian Tangent India.

Moving Ahead

The key words to future growth are expansion, organisation & consolidation, all of this through our motto of continued friendship. We also look forward to interaction with our senior and larger counterparts in UK & Germany. It's a pity that, in the words of 41 International President John Bellwood, "Tangent, who represent most of the former members of Ladies Circle, were not invited at the RTI AGM in Netherlands recently, under the umbrella of a 'Four Clubs One Vision' synopsis created by George Psaras, the RTI President as they were perceived to be 'not international'". We hope that one day, sooner rather than later, Tangent Clubs the world over get together to form an international body & get the recognition they deserve.

Germany Sponsors 41 Club No. 1, Kampala, Uganda

In 1991, the German Round Table Magazine "Echo" published a letter by President James Kiwanuka of Round Table No. 9, Jinja, Uganda, requesting German Round Tables to develop a friendly connection with their Table. He wrote: "Our Table was started in 1958 by expatriate staff from Europe. When Idi Amin seized power in 1971, it collapsed & was only revived in 1987". He continues: "... Uganda has gone through quite a bit of a turbulent political history in the past. But things have changed a lot in the past five years ... This is to request as many German Tablers as possible to please communicate and help building strong bridges between Uganda and Germany".

Herbert Kaiser, then OT Vice-President, took an interest in the '90s, & worked energetically towards establishing a connection. But at first he found success only on a personal level & despite personal invitations to each other they could not meet. Nevertheless Herbert succeeded in obtaining admission for James' two daughters and his wife Regina in German High Schools.

It was not until 2008, that Herbert & his wife Birgit traveled to Kampala, & were enthusiastically received by James. This was the beginning of a relationship based on mutual trust, friendship & cooperation & resulted in the creation of 41 Club No.1, Kampala, Uganda on 28 July 08! Back in Germany, Herbert won over the entire board of Old Tablers Germany, especially its president, Albert, for having taken over the sponsorship, especially the preparation & organization of a dignified & appropriate charter celebration!

President Albert & Herbert, with his wife Birgit, & the two OTD-IROs - Anno & Hans-Dieter traveled to Kampala in July 2009. To their delight, they found that British 41er John Caulkin from Stratford upon Avon with his wife, Cathy were already there!

Seven Ugandan 41ers were formally chartered on 10 July 2009 on the terrace of a beautifully located hotel, surrounded by an exceptional dance company. The German Tablers had provided everything. President 2009/10, Joseph Tinkamanyire (Tinka) received club banners, buttons & chain of office (very important!), stickers & gifts for each of the seven new 41ers. In return, their friends from Germany & England have been richly rewarded. The speeches had words of wisdom sprinkled with friendship & humour.

Our friendship now stands firmly on its feet. James has already attended the September 2009 German Half Yearly Meeting in Munster. Conversely, planning has begun for a trip of German "oldies" & their wives to Uganda in July 2010. The opportunities for deepening our friendship are great - we will realize them.

Beer, Boat Rides & Barbeques: Indian YAPS have a Blast on their Euro-Trip

Our trip to northern Europe started at Mumbai airport on the 30th of May, the nine of us were going to spend the rest of the month traveling together far & wide across Europe visiting the 4 beautiful countries of Denmark, Germany, Belgium and France. We were treated like VIP celebs from India - we had a blast!! The next day we organized 'The Indian Night'. Fittingly India won a T20 match & Denmark beat Sweden 1-0 in football. So we all decided to go out into town to celebrate!! It was the perfect end to a wonderful week in Denmark. We said our goodbyes & hopped onto a train to Germany.

In GERMANY we stayed in the humble but beautiful town of Schwerin for 4 days. Nakul & I stayed with Mr. Hajo Reuter, who is a hunter by profession and specializes in hunting deer. He was a lot of fun to talk to and interact with; he had a dog named 'Oontaplatz' which we liked very much. He also took me to play football at a local club with his friends.



In Schwerin we visited a hydraulic pump factory, the duke's castle which was the symbol of the city, went for yet another boat ride around the town & a plant/flower exhibition called the BUGA, which left a lasting impression on us. On one of the days we travelled to the city of Hamburg & visited its famed cathedrals, churches & the spectacular harbour... £ got to experience another exciting boat ride! from Schwerin we travelled to the harbour city of Bremen. Here all the 12 of us stayed together at a bed & breakfast hotel by the river. It was the first time we stayed together under one roof & consequently we as a group came a lot closer.

In Bremen we walked around the harbour and through the streets of the wonderful city. We visited the Werder Bremen football stadium & The Beck's Beer Brewery apart from which we also experienced the happening nightlife of Bremen City.

Our next stop was BELGIUM where we traveled a lot - 6 cities in a week!! First we stayed in a youth hostel in Westerlo for 3 days & traveled to Antwerp to spend the day. Here we visited the famous diamond museum & saw loads of Indian diamond merchants. In Brussels we tried the famous Belgian beer, visited a chocolate museum & saw the famous manekan pis. Next we went to the French speaking part of Namur which was a mountainous region with loads of steep cliffs and gorges. We then traveled to Brugge which is considered the Venice of Belgium because of its canals & of course went on yet another wonderful boat ride! After which we went to Roselare where we spent our last 2 days before we went to France. Belgium went by like a blur mostly because of all the traveling we did.

Our hosts in Roselare drove us down to FRANCE ...our last destination on our euro-trip. We first stayed in Lille for 2 days & were lucky enough to experience the festival of music. It was amazing to see the whole city out on the streets celebrating. Every corner had Street Dancers, Live Bands or DJs playing techno/trance...It was definitely a night to remember! The next few days our hosts Manon & Juliette took us to their beach house where we spent a lot of time together talking in French and teaching them some Hindi. It was lots of fun!

We went to the city of Bologna for a city tour & saw its famous chateau, & went to the northern tip of France, which had German bunkers from WWII, from where we could see England only 11kms away. It was the most scenic and beautiful place we visited on the entire trip. We then hopped on a train to Reims, the city of champagne - our last & final stop. We went to the Champagne factory of Moet & Chandon & Dom Perignon. My host Louis-Marie Marlo took us to meet his friends at a BBQ party. We met people from Brazil, China & Australia as well. It was an international party indeed. The next day our hosts were kind enough to take us to Paris where we went up the

Eiffel Tower- Right to the Top - & naturally all of us were overcome with joy by this majestic wonder of the world. We also walked through Champs Elysses & visited the Louvre museum. After this we bid goodbye to Europe & packed our bags to leave the next day. But little did we know the surprise in store for us the next day at the airport. Rushil, Ayesha and I were unbelievably given an extra day in Paris! Because Air France had over booked the flight - it was a scene straight out of a movie! With our 600 euros compensation & hotel accommodation for the night, we strolled around Paris like we owned the place! The Italian Earthquake Disaster

41 Club Italy made a presentation to the International AGM in Gloucester in April 2009 asking for donations to pay for the rebuilding of the community centre in Onna, a village near Aquila in Italy which had been devastated by an earthquake earlier in the year. 41 Club has responded positively to the appeal & various cheque presentations were made at the Gala Dinner during the 41 Club Italy AGM in Ascoli Piceno in June. Donations included a cheque for €1,000 from Forest of Dean 41 Club/41 Club Great Britain & Ireland following the International AGM. The earthquake this time was reminiscent of the earthquake appeal which had been launched through Round Table in about 1980. On that occasion, Round Tables in various countries sprang forward with aid.

A coach load of 41 Club members & their partners travelled to the earthquake zone immediately after the Italian AGM on Saturday 6th June. The authorities would allow only 4 members of 41 INTERNATIONAL to enter the restricted area - Werner Blessing (Switzerland), Hermann Proyer (Austria), Ha De Gesch (Germany) and John Bellwood (International President) were those who were accorded the privilege of entering into the earthquake zone. They were accompanied by Celso Cioni, the founder of Round Table Aquila and a resident of Onna.

The scene was that of total devastation, even though the earthquake happened some four months before, & there was a total carnage of broken buildings, broken homes, broken lives and broken hearts. Celso Cioni was in his house in Onna when the earthquake happened & he lost his wife and six friends of his daughter who were staying in the house that night. Celso had not returned to his house since the earthquake so this was his first visit. Further details of Celso's heartbreak would be unfair but what the visitors saw was residents living wherever they could - in the garage, in tents in the surrounding fields, in tents on the local rugby field at Aquila. The site for the building which 41 Club is raising money for was also inspected; the visit surrounded by so much devastation will remain a memory probably for evermore.

Celso received the donations on behalf of 41 Club Italy at the Gala Dinner that evening. Everybody who has donated or will donate is absolutely assured that their money is gratefully received & will be put to very good use.






