


Welcome International Vice President

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THE (PAPER) HINGE

(International Magazine for Former Members of Round Table)

An Obituary

You have only to visit your local newsagent to find a vast array of magazines for sale, covering subjects such as housekeeping, gardening, politics, sport, playboys, playgirls, clothing, no clothing, etc. It is abundantly obvious that the preferred method of reading for the vast majority of the population is the reading of printed matter; and the day of the Tablet, the iPhone, the Kindle, the internet to replace the printed paper is still many years (?) away.



Since I first heard about the existence of 41 INTERNATIONAL, the international magazine for former members of Round Table had been named Courier. In fact my archives revealed from a recent search a 1983/84 edition (I was still in Round Table then, just). It was number 6 and dated May 1984. The next edition of Courier I have is dated February 1997 and is number 19, implying that Courier was published once each year. This edition gave notice of the Great Britain AGM and International AGM in Glasgow, Scotland, in April 1997. I remember seeing some foreign gentlemen and Alan Reynolds (GB) disappearing into a separate room at the Conference and, on asking what they were up to, I was told it was "41 INTERNATIONAL".



Dieter Straka from Austria was asked to assume the post of Editor of Courier after Wolfgang Roesel in October 2002. Editions number 25 and 26 continued to be printed magazines but the AGM in Arras, France, in April 2004 withdrew adequate funding and Courier numbers 27 (September 2004) and 28 (December 2004) were then available only on CD. They extended to 68 and 70 'pages' respectively and sometimes contained translations into English, German, French and Italian (in no particular order). Courier on CD was not a success and publication ceased.





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Like a phoenix from the ashes, an International Newsletter (with pictures) was distributed to the delegates at the AGM in Dortmund in 2006 and Bob Parton (Germany and Birmingham, England) – a rising star in 41 INTERNATIONAL – agreed to put together a new international magazine.

Hinge or The Hinge (it had varied over the years) had been the title of the Great Britain 41 Club magazine but the name had been dropped in favour of what was considered a more appropriate name – it now has the title of "LINKS" (which is German for LEFT). Great Britain confirmed that there was no reason why Hinge or The Hinge should not be adopted by 41 INTERNATIONAL; www. hinge.de was not available but www.thehinge.de was, so a new International magazine called The Hinge was born.



Editions 1 (May 2006) to 11 (June 2011) of The Hinge were colourful, interesting, amusing, happy and were magazines which 41 Club members would enjoy reading at home, in the train, in an aeroplane, in the loo, and could be shared with their family and handed to anyone who wondered what 41 Club and 41 INTERNATIONAL was all about. The first and second Editors of The Hinge (Bob Parton and Rajan Mittal) have been most successful in producing a publication of which we can be proud and which has been printed at a cost lower than the budget set by the International Council.



But now – sadly, sadly, sadly – the International Board and/or the International Council has decided that The Hinge will be available only online. To an avid reader of The Hinge – and I know that I am one of hundreds, if not thousands – this decision is a tragedy. Quite frankly, very few will read the magazine on the internet whereas readers previously, I suggest, read it from cover to cover.

So goodbye, farewell, adieu, to The (Paper) Hinge. We loved you when we could pick you up, cuddle you, kiss you and take you everywhere with us. Unless, of course... we start all over again like we have done in Dortmund and publish as a magazine what is the greatest advert and communication for our movement, showing the world the good (charitable) work we do and the fun we have being amongst friends.

Discovering India on a Motorbike

Whenever the monkey bites me and the winter break for bikers in Europe gets too long, I travel to India. Travelling here is very easy, because of security, good infrastructure (hotels, lodging) and much more flexibility in traffic – which allows the rider (driver) more individuality in driving style.

Best equipped with a powerful Bullet 350, a mobile and a 41er directory from 2006/7, this year our journey took us from Goa to north India.

After 4 days through Mumbai, Pune and Nashik – famous not only for grapes – we arrived in the vicinity of Surat. During a lunch break I studied the 41er directory, called "the book". Soon I found a member interested in travelling.

I dialled his number to hear words that sounded like, "ulallalaala ulalalaa blabla" (is it Hindi or Gujarati for something like: hello, who's it?).

"Here is Heinz from 41," I said, "the crazy Austrian who travels through India on a motorbike!"

"Oh welcome, my husband is also in 41!" said the voice on my phone.

"I'm reaching Surat this evening and would like to have a beer with the 41ers of Surat!"

So things started getting set in motion...

5 minutes later I got a call back from Rajan Mehra. He promised to organise a meeting for me that evening. To explain the way, he asked me to hand the phone to my driver.

"I AM THE DRIVER!" I said.

"Ok ok, come into the city," I think he did not believe me, "stop at a distinct point and call me again, Surat is not such a big city!" That sounded easy for me, but Surat is a 2.5 million city, not big for an Indian, but very big for an Austrian. Our capital Vienna has just 1.8 million people and the second biggest town Graz, where we live, has just 275,000. I did as he told me, drove into Surat and stopped at a shopping mall.

15 Minutes later an employee of Rajan's stopped beside me and guided me very carefully through rush-hour traffic in Surat to Rajan and Jayshree's place. Of course we were home hosted, anything else is impossible in India.

After having refreshed ourselves, we were guided to the home of Surat's Chairman Jayesh and his wife Sangita, our hosts. It's the first "green" house in the city with solar power lit LED bulbs.

By the time we had showered, 10 more 41ers had arrived with their wives. Later the whole group of more than 20 moved to a nice restaurant. During a fine vegetarian dinner, we enjoyed a very interesting conversation. But...they were not very happy to hear that we would be leaving the next morning.

After a pleasant daytrip of 300 km we arrived in Ahmedabad, with a population of about 4.5 million. On a YAP tour of India a few years ago, my son had stayed with Dipak and Tejal Thakore. Now I contacted Dipak, who organised our stay as also dinner get-togethers with 41ers from 'Amdavad' for both our evenings.

Here too we earned no applause for leaving after 2 days, but our target was Rajasthan. Had we followed up



HUMAN? (ANIMAL!) INTEREST STORY The story of Jasmine, an abandoned dog that became an animal sanctuary's resident surrogate mother

A True Story



n 2003, police in Warwickshire, England, opened a garden shed and found a whimpering, cowering dog. The dog had been locked in the shed and abandoned. It was dirty and malnourished, and had quite clearly been abused.

In an act of kindness, the police took the dog, which was a female greyhound, to the Nuneaton Warwickshire Wildlife Sanctuary, which is run by a man named Geoff Grewcock, and is known as a haven for animals abandoned, orphaned or otherwise in need.

Geoff and the other sanctuary staff went to work with two aims: to restore the dog to full health, and to win her trust. It took several weeks, but eventually both goals were achieved. They named her Jasmine, and they started to think about finding her an adoptive home.

Jasmine, however, had other ideas. No one quite remembers how it came about, but Jasmine started welcoming all animal arrivals at the sanctuary. It would not matter if it were a puppy, a fox cub, a rabbit or, any other lost or hurting animal. Jasmine would just peer into the box or cage and, when and where possible, deliver a welcoming lick.

Geoff relates one of the early incidents. "We had two puppies that had been abandoned by a nearby railway line. One was a Lakeland Terrier cross and another was a Jack Russell Doberman cross. They were tiny when they arrived at the centre, and Jasmine approached them and grabbed one by the scruff of the neck in her mouth and put him on the settee. Then she fetched the other one and sat down with them, cuddling them."

"But she is like that with all of our animals, even the rabbits. She takes all the stress out of



them, and it helps them to not only feel close to her, but to settle into their new surroundings. She has done the same with the fox and badger

cubs; she licks the rabbits and guinea pigs, and even lets the birds perch on the bridge of her nose."

Jasmine, the timid, abused, deserted waif, became the animal

sanctuary's resident surrogate mother, a role for which she might have been born. The list of orphaned and abandoned youngsters she has cared for comprises five fox cubs, four

badger cubs, fifteen chicks, eight guinea pigs, two stray puppies and fifteen rabbits - and one roe deer fawn.

Tiny Bramble, eleven weeks old, was found semi-conscious in a field. Upon arrival at the sanctuary, Jasmine cuddled up to her to keep her warm, and then went into the full foster-mum role. Jasmine the greyhound showers Bramble the roe deer with affection, and makes sure nothing is matted.

"They are inseparable," says Geoff. "Bramble walks between her legs, and they keep kissing each other. They walk together round the sanctuary. It's a real treat to see them."

Jasmine will continue to care for Bramble until she is old enough to be returned to woodland life. When that happens, Jasmine will not be lonely. She will be too busy showering love and affection on the next orphan or victim of abuse.
